Does the proposal accord with the Economic Development Strategy?	Yes	The Economic Development Strategy recommends that the Land Use Plan should support a range of types of tourism, particularly supporting niche tourism (Recommendation 27). The Strategy identifies that heritage tourism, and particularly military heritage, is a niche market which is currently operating on Alderney, but for which more could be done to support the market. The proposal to provide protection for the site (in combination with protection afforded to other sites of significance) would therefore accord with the Economic Development Strategy. The site is currently used for agricultural land.

Does the proposal accord with the Natural Environment Strategy?	Yes	The site contains improved grassland, which falls under regional tier of the hierarchy of environmental designations set out in the Natural Environment Strategy (see Map F.5 in the Natural Environment Strategy). The site also contains a small amount of semi-natural broadleaved woodland, which falls under the local tier of the hierarchy of environmental designations (see Map F.6). Protection of the site for its heritage value would need to align with the protection of these habitats, and may provide opportunities for joint protection and management.
Does the proposal accord with the Built Environment and Heritage Strategy?	Yes	The Built Environment and Heritage Strategy recognises the importance of Lager Borkum, and recommends that it is added to the Register of Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments and Ancient Monuments (Recommendation 20). It also recommends that further consideration should be given to the need for additional protection, policies and procedures that might be required for such areas, to ensure that these assets are afforded the same level of protection and reflect best practice from other jurisdictions (Recommendation 22). The Strategy recognises the value of Batterie Falke & Lager Borkum (MH/031) from a Word War II constructions perspective, and recommends that it is added to the Register - this area largely overlaps with the submitted site. The site also includes the brick kiln south of Longis House (AR/006), which is also recommended for inclusion on the Register of Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments and Ancient Monuments. The site also includes known archaeological sites / areas of interest which, although not recommended for inclusion on the Register of Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments and Ancient Monuments, should be afforded protection through the Land Use Plan (Recommendation 37). The proposed use therefore aligns with the recommendations of the Built Environment and Heritage Strategy.

Assessment of Suitability, Availability and Achievability

Is the site suitable for the proposed purpose? The submission states that the site is of considerable historical importance due to its function as an Organisation Todt and SS camp during the World War II occupation. The submission states that ther evidence that Lager Borkum, along with other camps on Alderney, were inherently linked to other Holocaust sites in Europe. Given the historical importance of the site (in relation to both the role of fo labour and the wider occupation of the Island), it is considered that protection of the site is justified. Pending registration on the Register of Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments, interim policy protection will be afforded to this site through the Land Use Plan.

Is the site available for the proposed purpose?	Yes, with mitigation	The site is currently in private ownership, and the submission was not made on behalf of the landowner(s). Permission would need to be sought to add the site to the Register of Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments and Ancient Monuments. It is understood that the current use of the site is open land. The site is currently used as agricultural land. It is not anticipated that protection of the site would preclude its continued use for this purpose, although it may impact on its management, and the former function of the site should be acknowledged.

Yes, with mitigation	The site could be protected through inclusion on the Register of Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments, subject to the consultation and publication processes set out in the Building and Development Control (Alderney) Law, 2002 (this would be undertaken outside of the Land Use Plan review process).
