

POLICY AND FINANCE COMMITTEE (P&F) MANDATE 2023

General Responsibilities

- To advise the States and monitor and make recommendation to the States on all matters within its areas of responsibility.
- To be accountable for the financial management of the States.
- To operate in accordance with the States of Alderney Rules of Procedure, the Rules of Procedure for States Committees, States policies and extant States resolutions.
- To liaise and negotiate with the States of Guernsey on all matters relating to the provision of transferred services and finance and to maintain those relationships for the public benefit.
- To liaise with the General Services Committee, the Building and Development Control Committee and the Economic Development Committee in relation to their budget and legislative requirements.
- To be responsible for all matters not specifically falling within the mandate of the General Services Committee, the Building and Development Control Committee or the Economic Development Committee.
- To liaise with any other appropriate bodies and to consult with the general public on matters relating to its responsibilities.
- To be responsible for public communications relating to its responsibilities.
- To exercise functions conferred on the Committee by extant legislation and extant States resolutions.

Specific Responsibilities

The Committee is responsible for the following specific matters except where other committees have functions under legislation or extant States resolutions –

- The Island plan;
- Dealing with external authorities in fiscal and commercial matters;
- Relations with other islands of the Bailiwick;
- Discharging all matters affecting the island's constitutional position and relating to the regulation of the States of Alderney in particular under the Government of Alderney Law, 2004;
- All matters relating to International Conventions, Treaties, Agreements or extension of EU or UK legislation, in liaison with the States of Guernsey;
- Liaising as necessary with the Court of Alderney;
- The leasing and use of all States-owned Forts; and
- All matters relating to the sea and seabed.
- Carrying out all the functions formerly carried out by, or carried on in the name of, the States Employment Board (formerly the Civil Service Board).

Other Areas for which Responsible.

The Committee is responsible for the following areas except where other committees have functions under legislation or extant States resolutions –

- Elections;
- Census;

- Import and Export control and customs duties;
- Telecommunications;
- Postal Services, Philately and Currency;
- Gambling;
- Civil Contingencies;
- Dangerous Weapons;
- Civil Aviation Licensing;
- Energy;
- Regulation of companies and employment;
- Taxes, fees, and charges;
- Health and Safety at Work; and
- Land and property, compulsory purchase and beneficial ownership.
